Dear Parents.

Please take the time to read this short message. It is an appeal for your involvement! As many of you know 7th Epsom is a fairly large group and is able to provide great experiences to all of the children that come through our door.

For the avoidance of doubt, the group operates entirely with volunteers and fund

raising, every person who contributes to the success of 7th Epsom Scouts is unpaid and gives their time freely. Most of the leaders do not have children in the group anymore and still continue to provide their time. And we have a small team of volunteers who support with things like finance, collecting of subs, transport, Fireworks, arranging Jumble sales, Christmas Post, shooting club etc.

Without these fantastic people we would not be able to operate the kind of scouting we do.

A very important part of the success of 7th Epsom is fund raising to continue to do the activities we do.

SO - The appeal...

7th Epsom has around 215 young people regularly attending Beavers, Cubs, Scouts or Explorers. Which I estimate must mean at least 350 parents outside of those who already help with the group.

We recently had to cancel the jumble sale as we only had 5 parents come forward to offer help on the day of the sale.

So as well as the volunteers who help regularly we need parents to volunteer to provide adhoc help or support a committee to assist with the fund raising. Autumn is one of our busiest fund raising time.
