We are fortunate to have an amateur radio station in the Scout HQ operated by members of local amateur

radio clubs. The 'radio hams' have recently been providing their time to introduce the Scouts to ham radio as part of their Communicator Activity





Badge. Scouts have also been having fun learning about the phonetic alphabet and Morse code.

The radio hams opened up

the radio shack in the youth hall as part of this year's Jamboree On The Air (JOTA). This is a worldwide annual event which brings together Scouts from over 170 countries. It enables Scouts to connect with each other over the weekend of $18^{th} - 20^{th}$ October.The 7th Epsom radio shack was visited by several 7th Epsom beavers, cubs and Scouts as well as other members of local Scout Groups. They were able to talk to the radio hams who helped them to use the radio equipment to talk to Scouts in other parts of the UK and the world.

Our handmade bird boxes are flying off the shelf!



The Madagascar team have hand built and are now selling some fabulous bird boxes in order to raise funds for their projects next year! There are three styles which attract different birds - the 32mm hole boxes are for sparrows and nuthatches, the 25mm hole boxes are for blue, coal and marsh tits, and the boxes with half fronts are for robins. Each bird box is individually named and has instructions attached for how to hang it. One Explorer, Rowan, has also made up bird seed bags which are selling at £2 each too.

We had a successful sale at Glyn Christmas Fayre on 16th November and were at Rosebery Fair Friday 29th.

Here are some toilet facts that the Scouts have been learning:

- Water pollution kills around 10,000 people around the world EVERY DAY.
- Every 8 seconds a child under the age of five dies from diseases related to contaminated water.
- 2.3 billion people don't have somewhere safe and hygienic to go to the toilet
- 1 billion people practice open defecation
